Greetings of Peace:

On behalf of Georgia's Muslim community, we wish you well in your ongoing campaign to serve as the next Mayor of the City of Atlanta. We also thank you for meeting with CAIR Georgia earlier this summer to discuss issues of importance to Atlanta Muslims. We write now to invite your campaign to engage in direct dialogue with Muslim voters before the upcoming election.

As you may know, the City of Atlanta is home to dozens of Islamic houses of worship, as well as most of Georgia's 150,000 Muslims. Every day, Atlanta Muslims make positive contributions to our city. We serve as business owners, homemakers, teachers, custodians, construction workers, doctors, engineers, law enforcement officers, philanthropists, chaplains, and everything in-between.

Atlanta Muslims also care deeply about the future of our city. That's why our mosques, civic organizations, and civil rights groups are reaching out to each mayoral campaign with a united voice. Although the signatories to this letter cannot and will not endorse any particular candidate, we hope to educate Muslim voters about the goals and positions of every candidate, just as we hope to educate every candidate about the hopes and concerns of Muslim voters.

To that, end we are inviting every mayoral candidate to visit Atlanta Masjid of Al-Islam, our city's oldest mosque, and/or Al-Farooq Masjid, our city's largest mosque, to meet with voters and dialogue with community leaders.

Muslims gather every Friday afternoon for Jum'ah, our weekly prayer service, which starts around 1:30 pm and ends around 2:30 pm. This might be the best time for you to visit a mosque, set up a table with your campaign literature, and greet large numbers of Atlanta Muslim voters. Let us know if any particular Friday would work for you.

Finally, we encourage you to complete and return the attached candidate survey, which asks about issues of importance to Atlanta Muslims, including housing and the economy, public safety, religious freedom, civil rights, and anti-Muslim bigotry.
